Native Mongolian Delgerjargal Dugarjav earned her bachelor's degree from the Forestry Department of National University of Mongolia. Soon after graduation, she received a scholarship from the Indian Government to pursue her master's degree at the Forest Research Institute of Dehradun, India, where she worked on tree growth modeling.

After completing her master's degree, Delgerjargal worked as a researcher at the Institute of Geoecology at the Mongolian Academy of Sciences until she was selected as an International Fulbright Science and Technology Award grantee in 2008. She is currently a doctoral student at the Department

of Forestry, University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her present research involves conducting studies on the carbon dioxide mitigation capacity of boreal forest trees.

While at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, she has encouraged colleagues in the forest ecology field to share their professional and personal experiences. She hopes to contribute to forest management policy by highlighting the ecological significance of trees. Upon obtaining her Ph.D., Delgerjargal plans to continue her work in Mongolian forestry.
