Guan Wang is originally from Chongqing, China. He completed his basic four-year studies in biological science at Northwest A & F University in Xi'an before entering the Institute of Zoology (IOZ) at the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS) in Beijing for his master's degree in behavioral ecology. Guan included three years of wild giant panda behavior research into his master's thesis. At his graduation, he was awarded both the top prize for academic excellence and for student leadership at CAS.

Thanks to his 2008 International Fulbright Science and Technology Award, Guan is currently researching neuroethology as a doctoral student in the Biology Department at Boston University. With the help of cellular, molecular and behavioral methods,

Guan has been investigating the relationship between sexual behavior in mice and their neurobiological basis. His major areas of interests involve how behavior in mice is controlled, shaped or influenced through their neural features.
