Martin Petricic was born in Split, Croatia. While in high school in Split, he did an exchange year in Warwick, England as a Headmasters Conference (HMC) Scholar. Martin studied Naval Architecture and graduated with honors from the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Naval Architecture at the University of Zagreb, Croatia. He excelled in his studies, earning perfect GPA and was awarded with several scholarships and prizes. Mr. Petricic was also the vice president of the Croatian Association of Naval Architecture Students (CANAS), an organization which assists students with their studies and works with them on team projects; he additionally held student consultations for two courses, Ship Design, and Technical English
